We come, trusting in Jesus, the face, the voice, the presence of the God who loves us.


The scoffers of our age ask, 'why do you seek after God?' We come, in this time,

Love Divine, All Loves Excelling

God of Grace and God of Glory & Love Divine, All Loves Excelling were requested by Ian Laing. Harry Fosdick wrote God of Grace and God of Glory. He attended Colgate University, Union Theological Seminary, and Columbia University. Ordained in 1903, he pastored at the First Baptist Church in Montclair, New Jersey. He also served as associate minister at the First Presbyterian Church in Manhattan, New York. Charles Wesley, the author of *Love Divine, All Loves Excelling* is perhaps, the great hymn-writer of all times. Charles Wesley was the youngest son and 18th child of Samuel and Susanna Wesley, and was born at Epworth Rectory, Dec. 18, 1707. He is said to have written no less than 6500 hymns.
