The Old Rugged Cross was requested by Connie Nestor. George Bernard Shaw began the hymn in 1912 at an evangelistic meeting in Michigan. He was contemplating the meaning of the cross and was inspired to begin the song while meditating on John 3:16. He was unable to finish it until early in 1913. The song soon achieved wide popularity when it was introduced by evangelist Homer Rodeheaver. This hymn was not accepted by most major hymnals until the 1950s. One reason was the somewhat controversial nature of a hymn expressing such great affection for the cross itself, rather than for Christ, the one who died there. (From Hymnary.org)

AFFIRMATION OF FAITH (Unison)
