Members from around the world stretched her understandings of the Christian faith and the world. Her last call was serving as Director of Field Education at Louisville Presbyterian Theological Seminary.

Garnett has travelled to the Middle East numerous times since participating in a McCormick Seminary travelling seminar in 1981. In 1997 she taught while on sabbatical at the Near East School of Theology in Beirut. She has participated in the Syria-Lebanon Partnership Network trips to Lebanon and Syria every few years until the pandemic made the trips impossible. She serves on the Steering Committee of the Network and speaks often on Syria, trying to help church folk in the US grasp at least part of the complexity of the situation there.

Next up will be gathering items and donation to set up an apartment and provide for living expenses for a specific family. Blessings, Lynda


