

**K-5 FAITH FORMATION** —will meet Sunday, March 6 from 11:00 - 11:45 for a mystery project!





SUNCATCHER FUNDRAISER—A generous donor has arranged with the Blenko Glass Company of Milton, West Virginia for 50 suncatchers featuring a design by our own Bryan Zander that honors Riverside Presbyterian Church's 150 years of ministry to be produced. They are in the color they call "tangerine," which features a combination of reds, oranges, and yellows. Two examples of this suncatcher can be seen in the hallway across from the office area. #### **REFUGEES HAVE ARRIVED!**

As we visit with the AlHaffar family we learn a bit more about them and their journey....
Dad, Adnan, has two sisters. He, as the only son, was responsible for his parents. They are still in the camp in Jordan. This causes him great concern. The family has friends living on Devon whom they met at the camp in Jordan. Both families were initially told they would be relocated to Florida and instead landed here in snow storms! At least they have each other and us. Adnan and Hanaa are eager to learn English and have the children

enrolled in school. In their culture, students are grouped by ability. We explained that here they are grouped by age. That prompted a question about birthdays and Hanaa has to think hard to come up with those for her children. Birthday celebrations are not part of their culture, nor are birthday milestones. We explained how important knowing your birthday is in the US. It's nice to learn about their culture and traditions as they learn about ours. Every time we visit, they thank us for our generosity and say that God has blessed them with us in their lives. Please continue to pray for their transition to life in America.
